# CHOOSING AND DOWNLOADING VIDEO

**GOAL** Saving and Presenting Primary Sources Time Required **OBJECTIVES** Participants will: Distinguish between the various video formats. Execute the process of downloading video from a website. Standards **MATERIALS** Materials/Resources Using Primary Sources in the Classroom Computer with Internet access Projector and screen PREPARATION Ensure that you can access the Library of Congress website at http://www.loc.gov/. Test all of the links below.

### PROCEDURE Digital Video Formats

Movie formats are offered through the Library of Congress in three versions for viewing: RealMedia (.rm), Motion Picture Experts Group (MPEG or .mpg) and QuickTime (.mov). As with the audio formats, each video format requires a specific player or plug-in to view. The RealMedia format can be played on a Mac or PC, but requires the RealPlayer to view. The RealPlayer is available at http://www.real.com.

- 1. Open the Library of Congress website: http://www.loc.gov/.
- 2. Click on the *American Memory* tab on the LOC home page and click the *GO* button or click on the following link: <a href="http://memory.loc.gov/">http://memory.loc.gov/</a>.
- 3. Select the Browse button.
- 4. Choose Motion Pictures under Browse Collections Containing.
- 5. Select Film, Animated ~ 1900-1921.
- 6. Next to Browse Index select the Alphabetical Title List option.
- 7. Scroll down and select "The Enchanted Drawing."
- 8. Notice that there are three video options available and that each has an indication of the file size or purpose.
  - o Pros and cons of Real Media files:
    - One time viewing only
    - Does not download to a computer
    - Great for dial-up or low bandwidth conditions
    - RealPlayer is required

## CHOOSING AND DOWNLOADING VIDEO

- Not reusable in other applications
- Pros and cons of MPEG format:
  - Highest quality with a larger screen size
  - Reuse in PowerPoint, video or other applications
  - Longer download time
  - One minute of video = about 9 MB
- o Pros and cons of QuickTime format:
  - Smaller, downloadable files
  - Not as clear as MPEG files
  - Not reusable in other applications (PowerPoint)
  - Requires QuickTime Player for either a Mac or PC
  - One minute of video = about 6 MB
- 9. Right-click on the icon next to Quick Time format...5 megabytes.
- 10. Choose the Save target as... or the Save link as... option.
- 11. In the *File Name* text box, rename the video file "TheEnchantedDrawing".
- 12. In the *Save In* dropdown box, select where you want to save the file (for this lesson save the file to the Desktop).
- 13. Click Save.
- 14. Locate the MPEG file on your desktop and double-click it to view.
